Burnham and Unity Area

The Belfast and Moosehead lake Railroad has at least five problem beaver areas.

Problem 1 – Mile Post #32 in Burnham : Mile 32 is very remote with the best access being off the Battle Road which is off the Troy Road. The Battle Road appears to run by a home at its end. The ATV trail follows the old narrow gauge right of way and we have seen atv's on this trail when we have been clean out the culvert.

Problem 2 – Mile Post 17.5 [MP 17.5](#) is another area. There is a large bog here bounded by the Knox Station and Bailey Roads. The satellite map shows access points from home owners off the Knox Station Road and Bailey Roads. If one was to park on the Bailey Road and hike in, it's about a half mile in.

Problem 3 – Mile Post 9 - This is a large boggy area. Access on its westerly end if via the Gibbs Rd or Littlefield Rd. I would say from the map that access off the Littlefield Rd is most likely the best way. There is an access rd to the tracks at MP 10 and its one mile east to the bridge but as you see the tracks are bounded by the bog here on the north. One could park on Tank Stream Rd to the east (off South Brooks Rd/Littlefield Rd) and hike one mile into the area of the bog that

holds a large dam. Here the bog is to the south of the tracks. In this area the beavers build in the culvert at MP 9 and at the outlet of the bog.

Problem 4 – Mile Post 22 75 – Crosby Brook : Access is either from the fairgrounds and up the tracks or one of their trails. An alternate route is from the homestead on route 220 or the stream that crossing route 220.

Problem 5 – Mile Post 29.5 : The area in question is surrounded by the Winnecook Road to the south and west and the Morgan Road to the East. Satellite view shows trails off the Morgan Road into the bog. Other than that it's a hike in from the Winnecook Road from the east or west.
